Meeting was called to order at 10:22 A.M.

An email from Greg Lumbert was received and read regarding a snow mobile drag race event organized by a local snowmobile club to be held on the river February 23rd. The selectmen had no objections to the event.

Michelle Walther was scheduled to meet with the selectmen at the board meeting at 10:15 A.M. She did not attend.

The selectmen received a memo from Lynn Mealey requesting a new lighting fixture in the Town Office bathroom due to the dimness of the current lighting. Ben Sirois, a local electrician, had been in to assess what needs to be done and said he could do the job for less than 1,000 dollars – this being a high estimate. There is enough money in the Building and Lands account. The selectmen decided to table this issue until next meeting. They asked John Crocker to look into what can be done. He said he would check with Bob St. Pierre about the codes and would look into pricing.

Ed Gorham made a motion to accept the Lincoln County Agreement for dispatching services and sign the request for permission to enter into this agreement to be forwarded to the Maine Public Utilities Commission. Alfred Seymour seconded the motion. **VOTE – UNANIMOUS.**

Alfred Seymour made a motion to take the 5 year payment option on the six-month transitional budget for the County assessment. This is due to the transition by the county to a new fiscal year calendar that will run July through June. Ed Gorham seconded the motion. **VOTE – UNANIMOUS.**

Peter Hanley made a motion to pay the \$400.00 fine for which the Town was penalized due to the Public Works use of Herbicide without the proper licensing. Alfred Seymour seconded the motion. **VOTE-UNANIMOUS.** The selectmen signed the agreement with the State of Maine Board of Pesticides Control to pay the fine and to verify that steps have been taken to correct the violation. John Crocker agreed that herbicides will no longer be used by the Public Works department. Ed Gorham made a motion to take the money for the penalty from the Town's Contingency Account. Alfred Seymour seconded the motion. **VOTE-UNANIMOUS.**

An email received from Mark Turek requesting information from the Town of Randolph was received and read by the selectmen. Peter Hanley asked that Raeleen York reply to the request and that Peter Coughlan answer questions that Mr. Turek had regarding the website.

Ed Gorham made a motion to accept the minutes from the 1/5/10 meeting. Peter Hanley seconded the motion. **VOTE-UNANIMOUS.**

Ed Gorham began discussion about the snowplowing complaints he had received. One of the complaints was about plowing the end of McLaughlin Terrace. In the past the snow was plowed into the circle and now it is being plowed onto lawns. Ed Gorham made a motion that the snow plowing go back to being plowed into the circle. Alfred Seymour seconded the motion. **VOTE-UNANIMOUS.** John Crocker volunteered to call Mr. Barry to address this.

Next meeting will be held February 2, 2010 at 10:00 A.M.
