Meeting was called to order at 5:00 p.m.

Matt Drost made a motion to accept the **minutes of the May 12, 2020** meeting. Bob Henderson seconded the motion. **VOTE – UNANIMOUS.**

Art gave the Board a quote for taking down trees in the cemetery so that Angie Ellis can add it into her budget for the upcoming year.

Matt discussed plans for a public hearing and a special town meeting on changes to the Land Use Ordinance for the Solar Farm in Randolph. June 8th is tentatively set for the public hearing and it was thought that the special town meeting could be held that same night. The Clerk reminded the Board that 7 days is needed for posting of the warrant the articles for the meeting must be drawn up in a timely fashion.

Mat spoke briefly with Rusty Farrin of the Auction House about possibly holding the Town's annual town meeting there on July 22, 2020. This seems to be a possibility at this point. More information forthcoming.

Greg was at the meeting to update the Board on several Code Enforcement activities. Sam Snow got a sewer entrance permit from the town of Randolph a couple of years ago but never completed the connection roadwork. He is now ready to move ahead. It was felt that the original permits from the Town are still acceptable. Greg and Art discussed with the Board having expiration dates on Town permits and instituting a renewal fee in these situations.

Greg reported that nothing has been done at the Rausch residence to comply with code violations. Court action was discussed

Art had a bill for shimming and resurfacing in the amount of \$46,006.64 from Maine-ly Paving Service. The shimming on Birmingham Road was \$4973.11, The Barber Road

shim pavement was \$34,306.03 and Clark Street was \$6,727.50. All will be charged to the resurfacing account.

Mark e-mailed Kevin Ashline regarding the lawn at the Town Office and the cemeteries as they were looking very unkempt.

Mark also e-mailed Angie Ellis after a phone call to the office stating that someone wanting to purchase a cemetery lot had not luck in getting hold of Angie after several calls.

Next week, plowing bids will be opened at the beginning of the meeting.

Matt Drost made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Bob Henderson seconded the motion.
VOTE – UNANIMOUS.
